Appendix

This appendix contains the data behind NGO Monitor's report on Human Rights Watch's activities in 2008.

Division of effort

The weighted values used in this section all use the point system described in Table 2. Points were allocated based on the level of resources required for HRW to publish that type of document, and the expected impact of that document. Table 1 shows the old weighting system used in previous years' analysis. The point values have also been used as column headings in other tables to denote the document types.



Table 2 shows the count of document types according to country. All documents on the HRW website with significant reference to one or more of these countries were counted. Documents that did not appear on the HRW website were not counted, eg HRW's submission to the UN's UPR of Israel, which is available elsewhere on the internet. A "significant reference" to a country means a significant description of how that country violates human rights. In the case of Iraq and Lebanon where human rights violators in those countries may often be agents other than the country's own government (the USA in Israq or Hezbollah in Lebanon), publications were only counted if they condemned the country's government specifically.

Qualitative Analysis

Citations where HRW specifically condemned a country government for the following violations were counted. Note that citations for "Iraq" refer to condemnations of the Iraqi government, and not the Multi national Force or USA troops in Iraq. Citations were only counted if they condemned the government of that country, and not individual citizens.
